Archives Research Center Exhibit—Civil Rights Act of 1964

"Civil Rights in America" is the theme of Black History Month, 2014, and marks the fiftieth anniversary of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Signed by President Lyndon B. Johnson on July 2, the Act was a major turning point in American history as it moved towards ending Jim Crow laws and paved the way for future reform legislation. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., who was present at the signing, called the Act "the dawn of a new hope." The Civil Rights Act prohibited employment discrimination, called for the desegregation of public schools, outlawed segregation in many public spaces, and eliminated the discriminatory use of voter registration requirements. Materials documenting the Civil Rights Act, and outcomes of the historic piece of legislation found in several Archives Research Center collections are on display on the main level of the Atlanta University Center Robert W. Woodruff Library. Featured collections include the Morehouse College Martin Luther King Jr. Collection, the Johnson Publishing Company Clippings Files, the Vivian Henderson Papers, General Photographs Collection, and the Clarence Bacote Papers. The AUC Woodruff Library has a wealth of resources to be used during Black History Month. Library users may access the resources by clicking on **Find Materials, Databases, By Subject** and **Africana Studies** links on the Library's <u>webpage</u>.

The African-American Mosaic—A Library of Congress Resource Guide for the Study of Black History & Culture. A noteworthy and singular publication, the Mosaic is the first Library-wide resource guide to the institution's African-American collections. Covering the nearly 500 years of the black experience in the Western hemisphere, the Mosaic surveys the full range size, and variety of the Library's collections, including books, periodicals, prints, photographs, music, film, and recorded sound. Moreover, the African-American Mosaic represents the start of a new kind of access to the Library's African-American collections, and, the Library trusts, the beginning of reinvigorated research and programming drawing on these, now systematically identified, collections.

The African American Experience—The African American Experience has the widest depth and breadth of information available of any online database collection on African American history and culture. Produced by ABC-CLIO, an award-winning publisher, of reference, contemporary thought, and professional development content, created to help students, educators, librarians researching African American topics. Included is the most current scholarship and perspectives on African American themes.
