Delivering Thousands of Resources on Your Desktop

Did you know that from your campus office, home, or any location with an Internet connection, your AUC Woodruff Library provides full text access from its website (www.auctr.edu) to more than 145,000 electronic journals and monographs? And we continue to add more! In the past year, more than 19,000 electronic titles in subject areas matching the curricular offerings of our AUC campuses have been added to our virtual collections. Simply begin your research journey by using SmartSearch located on the Library's home page. Full text journal article delivery to your desktop is just as easy. Using SmartSearch, the full-text articles from more than 70,000 journals found in our electronic journal collections are available for delivery to your desktop. As well, journal articles requested through interlibrary loan may be delivered to your email. Both monograph and journal resources can be searched and read online and, in many cases, downloaded for more extensive review. Recent Developments in Open Access & Scholarly Communication

Open access publishing and self-archiving help ensure research is available in a free and unrestricted manner. This summer faculty in the University of California (UC) system, a consortia of ten public universities, took a major step to ensure that their research was openly accessible. On July 24, 13, the UC Academic Senate adopted a system-wide open access policy ensuring that articles produced by faculty are both widely accessible and available for re-use by the academic community and the general public. The policy affects more than 8,000 UC faculty and as many as 40,000 publications each year. The policy takes effect on three campuses November 1, 2013 with remaining campuses implementing in 2014. For our AUC Woodruff faculty, the Library's DigitalCommons at (http://digitalcommons.auctr.edu) e-scholarship repository can facilitate access to AUC research and scholarship, such as peer reviewed journals, theses and dissertations, and a variety of other resource files including text, media, presentations, images, and data sets.
